All the World's a Stage

All the world's a stage, And all the men and women merely players; they have their exits and their entrances; And one man in his time plays many parts. - William Shakespeare, "As You Like It"

In the quotation above, William Shakespeare hits the proverbial nail on the head in several

ways. First, he compares the world to a stage and indeed, it is... especially for Christians, whose every move is being watched and weighed by the unsaved world.

Second, we all have a part to play in God's grand design (see Psalm 139:16 and Proverbs 16:9) and, to a large extent, our heav-

enly rewards - not our salvation, which is the gift of God by grace through faith (see Ephesians 2:8-9) - are determined by how well we fill our particular role.

Third, there is no denying that we all have an entrance date (we call it our birthday) and an exit one, too. And fourth, during our earthly lifespan, the parts we play are many and varied, often determined by our respective age.

"The Bard of Avon" goes on to describe seven different "acts" of life, beginning with infancy and ending with old age, which he calls a "second childishness." For the sake of illustration, I'd like to limit those acts to three.

My first act lasted from birth to age 27.

During that period of time, I grew from a child to an adult, earned a college degree, and got married. Most importantly, I came to know Jesus Christ as my personal Savior and Lord.

Act 2 began when I started my ministry career, founding The Saints Prison Ministry in 1987. That was also the year that Bethany, our first child, was born. For the next two decades, I served as executive director of that organization, and God used me to grow it

from a single softball team that ventured into prisons in the MidAtlantic States to an international ministry with multiple teams in multiple sports and - in addition to our headquarters in New Jersey-branch offices in Colorado Springs, Richmond, Charlotte, and Atlanta.

After 24 years, more than 350 prisons, and 23,000 professions of

faith, the curtain fell on that stage of my life. Needing a new challenge and seeking a warmer climate, our family relocated to Vero Beach, Florida for Act 3, launching Risk Takers for Christ in 2011. Over the past 12 years, RTC has evolved from strictly a motivational ministry that conducted men's conferences, revival meetings, and periodic prison trips to one that uses sports to reach atrisk youth with the Gospel before they get into trouble with the law. We also publish a devotional message five days per week and, in 2022, planted a new church, Midway Bible Fellowship.

I fully expect to continue with RTC for as long as my good health allows, although I may not be running up and down a basketball

Showers of Blessing

"I will send down the showers in their season; they shall be showers of blessing." - Ezekiel 34:26

Here is sovereign mercy - "I will send down the showers in their season." Is it not sovereign, divine mercy? For who can say, "I will send down showers" except God? There is only one voice that can speak to the clouds and bid them send the rain. "Who sends down the rain upon the earth? Who scatters the showers upon the green herb? Do not I, the Lord?" So grace is the gift of God and is not to be created by man.

It is also needed grace. What would the ground do without showers? You may break the clods, you may sow your seeds, but what can you do without the rain? Just as absolutely needful is the divine blessing; you work in vain until God then bestows the shower and sends salvation down.

Then, it is plenteous grace. "I will send down the showers." It does not say, "I will send down drops," but "showers." So it is with grace. If God gives a blessing,

He usually gives it in such a measure that there is not room enough to receive it. Plenteous grace! We need plenteous grace to keep us humble, to make us prayerful, to make us holy; plenteous grace to make us zealous, to preserve us through this life, and at last to land us in heaven. We cannot do without saturating showers of grace.

Again, it is seasonable grace. "I will cause the shower to come down in their season." What is your season this morning? Is it the season of drought? Then that is the season for showers. Is it a season of great heaviness and black clouds? Then that is the season for showers. "As your days, so shall your strength be."1

And here is a varied blessing. "I will give you showers of blessing." The word is in the plural. All kinds of blessings God will send. All God's blessings go together, like links in a golden chain. If He gives converting grace, He will also give comforting grace. He will send "showers of blessing." Look up today, O parched plant, and open your leaves and flowers for a heavenly watering.
