"To wash and dress a corpse is a far different thing from making it alive: Man can do the one - God alone can do the other." - C.H. Spurgeon



My wife Deanna is adamant about one thing: she wants to be cremated when she dies. "I don't want a viewing," she has told me repeatedly. I guess she doesn't like the idea of

people walking by her open casket and saying, "Doesn't she look good?"

Being buried - or burned - doesn't matter to me, but I'm likely to follow Deanna's lead so that our ashes can be interred together. After 38 years of marriage and counting, it would be a bit weird to be buried in one place and have Deanna's ashes scattered elsewhere.

Sound morbid? Maybe so, but as you age, subjects like this begin to occupy your mind. In fact, I have already given Deanna and our kids some instructions for my memorial service. How important is it that Christians work together?

Well, in Jesus's "high priestly prayer," which He offered in the Upper Room on the night He was betrayed, Jesus prayed for unity. "That they all may be one," He said, "as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me."

In other words, with just hours left to live, the unity of His current disciples - and future followers - was foremost on Jesus' mind. And why was that? First, because Christian unity would demonstrate to the world that God the Father had sent Jesus the Son, thereby further legitimizing His ministry and teachings (John 17:23).

Second, Jesus taught in Matthew 12 that "Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation, and every city or house divided against itself will not stand." What Jesus was saying was that if we truly want to fulfill the Great Commission (see Matthew 28:19-20) and keep the Great Commandment (see Matthew 22:36-40), we need each other.























Follow Boldly

The Christian will be sure to make enemies. It will be one of his objects to make none; but if doing what is right and believing what is true should cause him to lose every earthly friend, he will regard it as a small loss, since his great Friend in heaven will be even more friendly and will reveal Himself to him more graciously than ever. You who have taken up His cross, don't you know what your Master said? "I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother... And a person's enemies will be those of his own household."

Christ is the great Peacemaker; but before peace, He brings war. Where the light comes, the darkness must vanish. Where truth is, the lie must flee; or if it remains, there must be a stern conflict, for the truth cannot and will not lower its standard, and the lie must be trampled underfoot. If you follow Christ, you will have all the

dogs of the world yelping at your heels. If you live in such a manner as to stand the test of the last judgment, you can depend upon it that the world will not speak well of you.

He who has the friendship of the world is an enemy to God; but if you are true and faithful to the Most High, men will resent your uncompromising commitment, since it is a testimony against their iniquities. You must do the right thing and not fear the consequences. You will need the courage of a lion to pursue a course that turns your best friend into your fiercest foe; but for the love of Jesus you must take your stand. To risk reputation and affection for the truth's sake is so demanding that to do it constantly you will need a degree of moral principle that only the Spirit of God can work in you. Do not turn your back like a coward, but play the man. Follow boldly in your Master's steps, for He has made this rough journey before you. Better a brief warfare and eternal rest than false peace and everlasting torment.




